## 1. ANNOUNCEMENT

## 2. JURISDICTION

- 2.1 The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by Motorcycling NSW which has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia Road Race Licences.
- 2.2 The meeting will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCR's) contained in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport, these Supplementary Regulations, the By-Laws of Motorcycling NSW and any final instructions approved by Motorcycling NSW. By entering this meeting all parties agree to comply with these rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

# 4. ENTRIES

- 4.1 Entries are now open and close last mail 01-Jul-2020. Late Entries not set.
- 4.2 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the North Coast Road Racers Inc, if such retention is approved by Motorcycling NSW.
- 4.3 Only entries received on the official entry form that is accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.
- 4.4 Entry fees will only be refunded if a rider informs North Coast Road Racers Inc, in writing, 10 days before the event. A medical certificate is required if a rider withdraws less than 10 days before the event.

## 7. INSURANCE

- 7.1 National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.
- 7.2 Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees. It is strongly recommended that competitors give consideration to taking out weekly benefits insurance.

## 8. MEDICAL SERVICES

Mobile 1st Aid will be in attendance from 9.00am until the completion of racing both days - Saturday and Sunday at Round 2.

## 9. SCRUTINEERING

- 9.1 Scrutineering will begin at 7:00 AM
- 9.2 Machines entered in the competition must have successfully passed a machine examination prior to taking part in practice, qualifying or racing. An MA decal will be placed on the front number plate to indicate that it has been successfully examined.
- 9.3 Current competition licences and full riding gear must be presented at scrutineering. Eligibility checks can take place at any time during the meeting. Machines which suffer accident damage in practice or race sessions must be re-examined before participating again.

9.4 In addition to supervising the pulling down and checking of machines after official protests have been received by the Clerk of Course in accordance with the GCRs, the Steward can order that

- any machine be measured and if this occurs the Scrutineer will supervise a team member to pull down any machine that has taken part in the event. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.
- 9.5 Machines will not be sealed for later checking after the event. All machines that are to be pulled down and scrutineered will take place at the circuit before the machine is released by the Scrutineer. A member of the rider's team must be available at all times to carry out the strip down under the control of the Scrutineer. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

## 13. RACE FORMAT

- 13.1 50cc 4-U9 Years Demonstration class will have 7 sessions of 4 minutes duration. All Rookies will have 2 x 6 lap races, 3 x 8 lap races, 1 x 10 lap races, and 1 x 12 lap race up to a maximum of 8 minutes in duration. Junior and Senior classes will have 2 x 6 lap races, 3 x 8 lap races, 1 x 10 lap races, and 1 x 12 lap race.
- 13.2 Saturday's Practice and Qualifying is a combined session of 1 round of 6 minutes for each class of Juniors & Seniors and will establish the start grid positions. Sunday will be 4 warm up laps and then grid up in starting position at the start line and prepare for start of racing
- 13.3 Race format will be at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course, depending on the circumstances on the day.
- 13.4 SENIOR RECREATION SESSIONS This is a <u>non competition</u>ride no racing. Machines A 2nd bike not being used in competition class is permitted. No passing of other riders on straights.

## 15. AWARDS AND PRIZEMONEY

Awards of the same or equal value will be awarded at each round to all riders in the 4-U9 Years 50cc Demonstration.

Awards will be awarded at each round to 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in each Junior and Senior competition class.

2020 SENIOR CLUB CHAMPION – Will be awarded to the senior with the highest individual class point score of all senior classes. If a tie on points occurs, the competitor who has the greatest number of higher individual race placings in the series (excluding the dropped round) will be named Senior Club Champion.

# 16. GST

The Goods and Services Tax affects the payment of prizemoney. If you do not provide an ABN or declare the sport is a hobby, the Promoter must withhold 46.5% of prizemoney over \$50.00 which is otherwise payable to you. Please tick one of the boxes on the entry form and if appropriate provide your ABN to ensure the full amount of prize money is paid to you.

## **18. MACHINES AND RIDERS**

- 18.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Road Race competition.
- 18.2 Multiple entry of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.

18.3 All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Road Race competition & all machines must comply with NCRR track protection rules.

18.4 All motorcycles, equipment and protective clothing must be scrutineered before entering the circuit and comply with 2020 MoMS for road racing. Riders are to download and complete the pre scrutineer form from <a href="http://www.northcoastroadracers.com">http://www.northcoastroadracers.com</a>

## 18.5 2020 SNR CLASS CHANGES -

Road Race Lites up to 250cc 4 stroke single cylinder & up to 150cc 2 stroke road bike resembling silhouette of road or road race bike. NO GP Motor or Moto3 Bike.

Road Race Heavy up 500cc road or road race bike, single or multi-cylinder resembling silhouette of road or road race bike. Includes Moto GP Motor & Moto3 Bike.

Open Road Race up to 500cc Road Race or Dirt bike, 2 or 4 stroke, Single or multi-cylinder (includes motards) For all other class information see further details on website.

- 18.6 Scrutineering stickers are to be placed on front plates of all bikes after scrutineering has been passed. No bike will be allowed on the track without a sticker.
- 18.7 Cameras Cameras may be fitted to the motorcycle provided they are securely mounted. Camera mounts on the motorcycle are subject to approval by the Chief Scrutineer.
- HELMET CAMERAS ARE NOT PERMITTED unless the camera is integrated into the helmet, by design or manufacturer.
- 18.8 Multiple entry of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.
- 18.9 Change of machine is permitted at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course and must be notified in writing at least 10 minutes before the next race for that class. The rider can continue in the class and must start at the rear of the grid.
- 18.9.1 Noise &/or Fuel Testing may be carried out at any time during this meeting

#### 19. RIDING NUMBERS

Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their registered riding number or their preferred riding number. All others will be allocated numbers at the North Coast Road Racers Inc's discretion.

All number plates on all machines MUST comply with the GCRs and must not contain any decals or advertising other than the required MA decal.

#### 20. GRID POSITIONS

20. GRID POSITIONS 20.1 Grid position from heat 1 of each event will be from qualifying. 20.2 Grids for each subsequent heat will be finishing order of the previous heat. 20.3 Any rider who does not appear in the results of the previous heat will be gridded at the rear of the grid for the next heat. Pole position will be inside line for 1st corner.

#### 21. RIDERS' BRIEFING

A riders' briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing, which ALL competitors MUST attend. Details will be included in the final instructions.

## 22. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION

The events will be held on a bitumen circuit at Mountainview Hillclimb Complex MVRG, 262 Clarence Way, Mountain View of a length of 562 metres. Direction of racing will be Clockwise.

#### 23. TRACK INSPECTION

All competitors will be given the opportunity to walk and inspect the track prior to any on track participation. This inspection must be done on foot and competitors are reminded that service vehicles may be in operation on the circuit at this time.

## 23.1 TRACK DISSATISFACTION

Competitors who are not satisfied with any aspects of the track can present these concerns to the Clerk of Course. If those concerns cannot be resolved, the competitor will be invited to withdraw from the meeting.

# 24. FACILITIES

No additional facilites are offered at this Event.

## 25. NOISE

Noise testing may take place at any time at the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer or the Clerk of Course. Refer to GCR 12.10 for details.

# 26. TYRES

26.1 Tyres: See the Clubs website www.northcoastroadracers.com for information regarding tyres. STOCK CLASS TYRE — tyre size to be open and ADR approved. TYRE WARMERS — Tyre warmers must be run from generators (not to use venue power). Riders to please bring own generators for tyre warmers. GENERATORS ARE TO BE PLACED AND USED IN THE SIGN POSTED 'GENERATOR PARKING AREA'

# 27. ANTI-DOPING POLICY

27.1 All competitors and officials are advised that drug testing may take place in accordance with MA's Anti-Doping Policy, as carried out by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority. Refer to GCR 11 for details.

27.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors contact the Drugs in Sport Hotline, ph: 1800 020 506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prizemoney may be delayed at [Insert RCB] discretion until the results of the tests are known.

# 28. DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

All competitors and officials are advised that random drug and alcohol testing may take place during the competition. Refer to GCR 11.27 for details on the Safety Policy – Drug and Alcohol testing.

# 29. CODE OF CONDUCT

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of MA's Code of Conduct contained within MA's Member Protection Regulations, found at www.ma.org.au or Appendix 3 of the GCR, which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. This Code of Conduct applies to this Meeting and will be enforced.

## 31. DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC INFORMATION

STARTING PROCEDURES: Rider is to position themselves on their allotted grid position on the starting grid. The front wheel must be inside the allotted box. The front of the front wheel must be behind the front line of the riders starting position. When the starter is content with the positions of the riders on the grid, the red flag will be lowered to the ground over a period of 3 to 5 seconds. Once the red flag is on the ground, any movement of the rider or bike will be regarded as a JUMP START (excluding the

throttle hand). Within a period of 3 to 10 seconds, the Australian flag will be raised to signal the start of the race. The rider or riders will be informed of a jump start during the race via a board at the finish line or after the race. There is no restarting of race because of a jump start - only penalties. Penalties for Jump Start - 1st offence 15 second penalty, 2nd offence 25 second penalty, 3rd offence 45 second penalty, any further penalties will result in exclusion from the meeting.

NOISE: All machines must comply with the requirements of the GCRs, track licence, and local council and Government requirements - Mountain View 95Dba.

Scoring - Series: Scoring will be as per GCRs i.e. 25 points will be allocated to the overall 1st place at the end of each meeting, 20 pts for 2nd place, 18 pts for 3rd place, 17 points for 4th place, 16 points for 5th place, etc, to be accumulated over the 8 rounds dropping the worst point score round, with the maximum possible being 175 points achieved per class for the Series. Riders must compete at 4 of the 8 rounds to be eligible for Series Awards.

#### **COVID 19 RESTRICTIONS**

#### <u> ALL ENTRIES ARE TO GO THROUGH RIDERNET - NO ENTRIES ON DAY OR CASH PAYMENTS</u>

PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT UNDER THE CURRENT COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS, EACH RIDER WILL ONLY BE ABLE TO HAVE ONE PERSON ACCOMPANY THEM INTO THE GROUNDS. YOU WILL NEED TO NOMINATE YOUR ADDITIONAL PERSON WITH YOUR ENTRY THROUGH RIDERNET. A list of persons coming to the event will be at the gate and marked off on admission. Contact details for all present will be recorded.

## ONE PERSON RULE MEANS

- A person over 18 attending with a rider who is under 18 Years eg rider and parent/guardian
- A person over 18 attending with a rider who is over 18 eg mechanic/friend NOT A CHILD
- The ONLY CHILDREN ALLOWED IN THE COMPLEX WILL BE RIDERS 4 YEARS AND OVER
- NO SPECTATORS PERMITTED

Wristbands will be supplied to each rider and one accompanying person after temperature check has been undertaken. Anyone on the grounds without a wristband will be asked to leave. Paddock area will be marked for competitors with a clear area between each marquee with spacing a minimum distance of 2m

TRANSPONDERS: Transponder hire - All riders must leave a \$50 cash deposit or race licence for transponders at race meeting. The \$50 cash deposit will be refunded when the transponder is returned. If the transponder is NOT returned you WILL be charged \$550.

<u>CAMPING:</u> Camping is permitted. Fires are only permitted for cooking purposes and are to be contained in a fire pit.

Injuries: All injuries MUST be reported to the Clerk of the Course.

Pit Area: No riding of machines is allowed in the pit or paddock area, any breach will result in exclusion of the corresponding competitor from the meeting. Only rider and mechanic are allowed in the pit area. ENCLOSED FOOTWEAR MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES.

Car Park: Riding of machines in the car park is not permitted. All bikes must be walked out from the pit area to the car park.

Animals: Animals are not permitted within the confines f the complex unless they are being used to alleviate a person's disability. Anyone found to have brought an animal onto the premises will be asked to leave.

Score Tower: The score tower is off limits to all persons. Exemptions will be made to officials of the meeting.

Code of Conduct - Just a reminder to all participants, officials and parents that the Motorcycling Australia - CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated in the GCRs which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings) applies to this meeting and shall be enforced. There are signs at the entrance to the pit gate and around the sign on desk about the Code of Conduct - please read these signs.
